

History

Ford built quite a few special cars during the 1960's. Some were subcontracted out to others, such as the Shelby Mustangs. But by 1968, Ford decided that they could build these types of cars themselves and exercise more control. Control was thrown out the window when they decided to hire Kar Kraft in Brighton, MI to build the most outrageous musclecar ever, the Boss 429 Mustang.

The Boss 429 was an engine slated by Ford to replace the 427 and give the 426 hemi more competition. However, NASCAR mandated that Ford produce a minimum of 500 vehicles using this power plant and the Boss 429 Mustang was born. The car was expensive to build, requiring significant modifications. It is likely that Ford lost money on every car built. But on the other hand because of the power these engines could develop, NASCAR outlawed all hemi combustion motors. Due to the limited production and intense engineering these cars are steadily appreciating and finally getting the interest they deserve.

This particular car, KK# 2210 rolled off the assembly line on October 13, 1969. It was originally slated to be delivered to Jack Madden Ford in Norwood, Massachusetts according to the Marti Auto Works Deluxe report. But the factory invoices from Lois Eminger lists Bennington Ford in Bennington, Vermont as the dealer sold to. So the original seller is in question. Most likely the car was traded between dealers since it was produced for sale on October 21st 1969 but actually sold on October 19th 1970.

But we do know some information. KK# 2210 is on its 3rd owner currently but some of its owner history has been tracked down here. No matter where the car was originally sold... it was sold on October 19, 1970 as noted on the Marti Deluxe report. But with the car being released for sale on October 21st 1969 it must have been traded between Ford dealerships for almost a year before being sold. The first owner, an Air Force enlistee, put the car up for sale in 1971 in Indiana, when he got called to service, for a paltry \$2500. He was even leaning towards an Indiana Toyota dealership for a quick sale when the 2nd owner, Bill Grant currently of Boise Idaho, saved it. Bill knew exactly what he was getting since he was a 1969 Boss 429 owner already. This 1970 Boss was purchased with 11,000 miles under its belt. The questionable options of the gauges and undercoating were already on the car at that time, although the Oil Temp gauge wasn't hooked up yet. Also the traction bars were on it. But as with most of these cars, the thermactor smog system had already disappeared.

Driven during good weather days only and always stored in a garage until a pesky Oring leak problem parked it after only a year or two. And as any Boss 429 owner knows the easiest way to pull the head to fix is to pull the whole motor. But as things go, the motor didn't get repaired for years. Due to a number of reasons the not least of which was a couple of interstate relocations. Plus due to an unfortunate accident with the 1969 Boss during these years of storage the 1969 Boss 429 had a running 820-S NASCAR motor begging to be dropped in and ran. So in 1988 the 1970 Boss 429 was revived

with the 1969's motor and transmission. And at this time the oil temperature gauge was wired. Which involved putting a hole in the crossmember for clearance. But the hole was reinforced with a piece of pipe tubing. The 1969 Boss body was parted out and sold. But the 1970 was alive and kicking for more ½ mile action and had been painted black. But had come back from the paint shop missing its KK tag and warranty stickers on the drivers door.

The 1970 numbers matching motor and transmission were still stored and awaiting repair. The 1969 motor/transmission did infrequent service until November 2003 when the 3rd owner, Jim Hayward, purchased the 1970 Boss 429 with only 29,000 miles on the odometer. And he purchased it for much more than the \$2500... or even the \$5000 price asked when new. But he did get a low mileage 1970 Boss 429 with two motor and transmission combos. All it took was repairing and reassembling the 1970 Boss motor and running it on a dyno just for his own personal information. 394 horse at 5500 rpm and 423 ft/lbs of torque at 3500 rpm through all stock parts except for a mild cam. Machine shop only had to clean and polish the crank and just hone the cylinder walls. So everything internal was standard during the rebuild. And for anybody who's tried getting Boss 429 parts knows how much of a trial that can be. These parts are not exactly found just lying around at the parts stores. And when they are found they come at a dear price.

Lastly the body had to be stripped and repainted the original Grabber Blue again. And all the documentation for the missing door tags had to be recovered. That's where the Marti Auto Works Deluxe Report comes in really handy. Just send them your VIN and they can look up on the original Ford computers all the information on your car. Which helps immensely, and they sell reproduction door tag stickers also. Just had to get a KK sticker with Marti Report KK# from any number of sources. That's where ECS Automotive Concepts came to the rescue, with quality reproductions of any number of stickers and decals. Jim purchased a new reproduction KK door tag and all sorts of under hood and trunk decals to replace after the new paint job. So paint is done... interior cleaned and re-dyed to like new condition...matching number motor and transmission are installed and running...missing decals and stickers are in place...all that's left is to continue getting missing parts to finish. Export brace was left in Cape Cod during one of the relocations second owner said. And snorkel was left god knows where. Also the smog system wasn't even on it when the second owner purchased it, so that is still left to be replaced. Have new set of Magnum 500's with Goodyear radials waiting for install already. And lastly any of those many little things that always show up when you restore a classic Mustang.

Thus ends the history of a 1970 Boss 429 Mustang KK# 2210...so far... current as of June of 2003. But with tracking down those elusive parts, things might be added at any time. Just wait and see....
